#### **SOURCE A**

From the address made by President Harry S Truman to the US Congress on 12 March 1947, announcing the Truman Doctrine.

The very existence of the Greek state is today threatened by the terrorist activities led by communists. Greece must have assistance if it is to become a self-supporting and self-respecting democracy. The United States must supply that 5 assistance. At the present moment in world history nearly every nation must choose between alternative ways of life. The choice is too often not a free one. I believe that it must be the policy of the United States to support free peoples who 10 are resisting attempted subjugation by armed minorities or by outside pressures. I believe that we must assist free peoples to work out their own destinies in their own way.

#### Source B

From an article printed in the Soviet newspaper 'Izvestia' on 17 March 1947, in response to the announcement of the Truman Doctrine.

Whatever arguments are used to justify American claims to domination in Greece, they cannot be justified by a defence of the freedom and independence of the Greek people. What is socalled 'American responsibility' but a 5 smokescreen for a plan of expansion? Justifications to the effect that the USA is called upon to 'save' Greece from the expansion of so-called 'totalitarian' states, are not new. Hitler also blamed the Bolsheviks when he wanted to 10 open the road to conquests for himself. Now the Americans try to take Greece under their control and by raising a clamour about 'totalitarianism' attempt to disguise their plans of expansion.

0 1 With reference to these sources and your understanding of the historical context, which of these two sources is more valuable in explaining the Truman Doctrine? [25 marks]
