Source A

From 'The Sermon on Indulgences', delivered by John Tetzel, a Dominican preacher selling indulgences to raise money for the building of St Peter's, 1517.

All who confess and in penance put money into the box will obtain complete cancellation of their sins. Why are you standing there? Run for the salvation of your souls!

Hear the voices of your wailing dead parents who say, 'Have mercy upon me because we are in severe punishment and pain. From this you could redeem us with a donation and yet you do not want to do so. We have created you, fed you, cared for you and left you worldly goods. Why then are you so cruel that you do not want to save us, though it only takes so little? You let us lie in flames so that we only slowly come to the promised glory'.

Source B

From the 95 Theses, drawn up by Martin Luther, 31 October 1517.

The Pope can cancel no guilt, but can only declare and confirm that it has been cancelled by God.

Christians are to be taught that he who sees a needy person and passes him by, yet gives money for indulgences, does not buy papal pardon but God's anger.

They preach only human doctrines who say that as soon as the money drops into the money chest, the soul flies out of purgatory.

It is not Christian teaching to preach that those who buy indulgences have no need to repent of their own sins.

If the Pope knew the methods of the indulgence sellers, he would rather that the Basilica of St Peter were burnt to ashes.
