## Data Sheet for On the farm

### Dairy farm

A dairy farm is a farm where cows are kept for their milk.



The amount of milk a cow produces is called the **milk yield**.

This amount is measured in litres.

In the UK, the mean milk yield per cow per year is 7944 litres.

Farmers usually sell the milk for between 30p and 34p per litre.

## Keeping pigs

Pigs are usually kept in buildings called **sties**.

Each **sty** should have a covered area to keep the pigs dry.

Each sty should have a gate at one end to allow access to open space.

Pigs like to have space to run around and digging areas to look for food.



A mother pig is called a sow.

Baby pigs are called piglets.

The table shows the minimum area of sty needed for sows and their piglets.

	5 or fewer	6 or more
Sow	2.48 square metres each	2.25 square metres each
Piglet	1.80 square metres each	1.64 square metres each
