Which **one** of these actions would you recommend to the government, and why?

I would recommend the government to spend more money on training and job creation.

"Governments, employers and individuals should set aside more of their income for lifelong learning." as stated in Source 3. According to Source 2, one cause of income inequality is people having unequal access to education. This means that some people can only do low skilled jobs with their level of education and some can do high skilled jobs because they are more educated. Source 2 stated that a chief executive from a top fashion company can earn ~~the~~ the lifetime income of a textile worker in Bangladesh in just four days. This shows how serious the issue of income inequality has become.

Spending more money on education and training reduces income inequality because if the people with a lower education level are ~~educated~~ educated and given training, they can succeed in their country. In Source 3, the person now owns a successful company because their father invested in their education. If the government invest in education and training, this impacts the ~~con~~ country because

all of the people would be successful, and income inequality is reduced. In source 4, Iran states that "spending about 13% of a country's annual income on public services reduces income inequality by about 20 per cent". Therefore, spending more money on training ~~is~~ is effective for reducing income inequality.

However, it costs a lot to give people training and education. The tuition fees in some schools nowadays are increasing due to inflation, and some equipments are needed for training, and all of that requires ^{a lot of} money. ~~But~~ Even though it costs a lot, giving training and education to people, especially younger people, is worth it because they are the future. If they are educated, they can do high skilled jobs and make a lot of money. Once they do, ~~they~~ they can repay the government ~~for~~ for giving them education. Additionally, the educated people might not agree because there will be more competition for high skilled jobs.

Increasing the tax paid by people with high incomes is not a sustainable solution. The people paying higher taxes might not be satisfied with this ~~ed~~ change. They might ~~move~~ move to another country to avoid paying higher taxes, and ~~this does not help the country's~~ economy.

Introducing more sustainable development policies is not a good recommendation either. People might not follow them if it does not ~~have~~ benefit them. ~~For~~ For example, rich or educated people might ignore those policies since only the less educated people ~~is~~ benefit ~~from~~ from the policies.
