## 有声阅读与网络文学的未来

有声出版物的历史已有80余年,不过有声阅读成为"现象",还是移动互联网崛起之后的事情。据说前几年,由于版权意识淡薄,曾有一位网文作者,其作品在某听书软件上播放量已超过两亿,但他本人竟完全不知情。

现在多数知名网文作品都可以通过听书的方式阅读。人们可以边听书边做其他事情,比如我们通过阅读平台读一部小说,倘若不想因锻炼而中断,就可以改用听书形式。再比如人们在家里可以边听书边洗碗。

由于网文平台本身交流的便捷性和即时性,作者会觉得与读者之间的距离太近。从某种意义上说,读者成了网络小说创作的一种重要参与力量,他们的情绪、意见往往会在不同程度上左右作者对故事、人物的设计。这种来自读者的"交流的压力"并不总能带给创作积极的影响,作者可能要不断妥协,也可能会折损原有的设想。

而有声阅读是一种间接的阅读,这就意味着作者无须直接面对读者,在作者与读者之间,还有"主播"在发挥作用。这种"间接阅读"的特性有可能缓解作者与读者之间的紧张。主播完全可以承担一个"选家"的角色。他们也许并不创作,但却可以发挥自己的敏锐性和鉴赏力,这对网络文学只会是一种推动力量。

网络文学对于受众有很强的依赖性,有声读物成功地引起了儿童对文本的情绪反应,也便利了那些难以获得纸质书或因视力问题、文盲或阅读障碍而无法阅读的人。可见在未来的 网络文学中,有声阅读必不可少。

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
