The examination assesses your response to visual stimuli and involves direct observation from primary sources, recording, analysis and 2D and/or 3D development.

At the end of the examination, fasten all your work securely together in the top left-hand corner with the Controlled Test examination piece(s) on top.

Record, analyse and develop your ideas from direct observation and personal experience.
