
## **READ THESE INSTRUCTIONS FIRST**

## Drawing and/or Painting from a Living Person

Candidates must choose one of the options below.

Candidates should be instructed that, in either question, the relevant parts of the model's surrounding should be considered as part of the study.

1 The model is seated, with the hands held in the lap and the feet crossed at the ankles.

Candidates should be instructed that they are to make a study of the whole figure. They may **also**, if they wish, include studies of other details such as the head or hands. These may be completed on an additional sheet.

2 The model, seated at a table, is wearing earphones connected to a small music player which is held in one hand, while the other hand adjusts the controls.

Candidates should be instructed that they are to make a study of the head and shoulders. They may **also**, if they wish, include studies of other details such as the head or hands. These may be completed on an additional sheet.
