1 The model is seated sideways, with one arm resting on the back of the chair.

2 The model is reading, seated at a small table. One hand is placed on the book, while the other hand rests on the opposite arm below the elbow.

Candidates should be instructed that they are to make a study of the head and shoulders. They may **also**, if they wish, include studies of other details such as the head or hands. These may be completed on an additional sheet.
