READ THESE INSTRUCTIONS FIRST

These instructions give details of the apparatus required by each candidate for each experiment in this paper. A summary of the questions that will be presented to the candidates is included, where appropriate, to allow the Biology teacher to test the apparatus appropriately. **No access to the question paper is permitted in advance of the examination session.**

If a candidate breaks any of the apparatus, or loses any of the material supplied, the matter should be rectified and a note made in the Supervisor's Report.

If arrangements are made for different sessions for different groups of candidates, care must be taken to ensure that the different groups of candidates are effectively isolated so that **no information passes between them.**

Supervisors are advised to remind candidates that **all** substances in the examination should be treated with caution. Pipette fillers and safety goggles should be used where necessary.

In accordance with COSHH (Control of Substances Hazardous to Health) Regulations, operative in the UK, a hazard appraisal of the examination has been carried out.

The following codes are used in the left margin where relevant.

C = corrosive substance

F = highly flammable substance

H = harmful or irritating substance

O = oxidising substance

T = toxic substance

Instructions to Supervisors

Each candidate must be supplied with:

For question 1

- (i) Piece of celery (the petiole), about 5 cm long, fresh and dry.
- (ii) Slice of Irish potato tuber, *Solanum tuberosum*, with no peel (skin), 2 cm thick, 5 cm or more in diameter.
- (iii) Scalpel or sharp knife.
- (iv) Forceps.
- (v) Iodine in KI solution, with pipette dispenser, labelled 'Iodine solution'.
- (vi) White tile.
- (vii) Paper towels.
- (viii) Access to tap and sink.
- (ix) Hand lens.
- (x) Ruler, mm.

For question 2

- (i) Specimen labelled **W1** – white of hard-boiled egg (no yolk). Each candidate will require approximately 1 cm³
- (ii) Specimen labelled **W2** – a piece of fresh or dried coconut flesh, approximately 1 cm³.
- (iii) Six test-tubes, in supporting rack, with means of labelling test-tubes.
- [F][H]** (iv) Ethanol (industrial methylated spirit), 25–30 cm³, in test-tube, labelled 'Ethanol'.
- (v) Biuret reagent, labelled and in form familiar to candidates.
- (vi) Spatula.
- (vii) Supply of distilled water, with pipette, labelled.
- (viii) Scalpel or sharp knife (can be the one used in question 1, if washed).
- (ix) Other apparatus from question 1.

Note: Ethanol is flammable, therefore no naked flames such as lighted Bunsen burners must be in the laboratory during the examination.
