- (b) Explain why Peter made this speech. [6]
- (c) 'The church would not have spread without Peter.'

- 2 (a) Describe what happened after **all** the apostles were arrested, up until they were brought to the Sanhedrin (**RSV** Council). [6]

- (i) how Philip was chosen as one of the Seven, **and**
- (ii) Philip's work in Samaria, before he met Simon the sorcerer. [6]
- (b) Explain possible reasons why Philip was in Samaria. [6]
- (c) 'Stories about Philip should not have been included in the Acts of the Apostles.'
To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered more than one point of view. [8]
