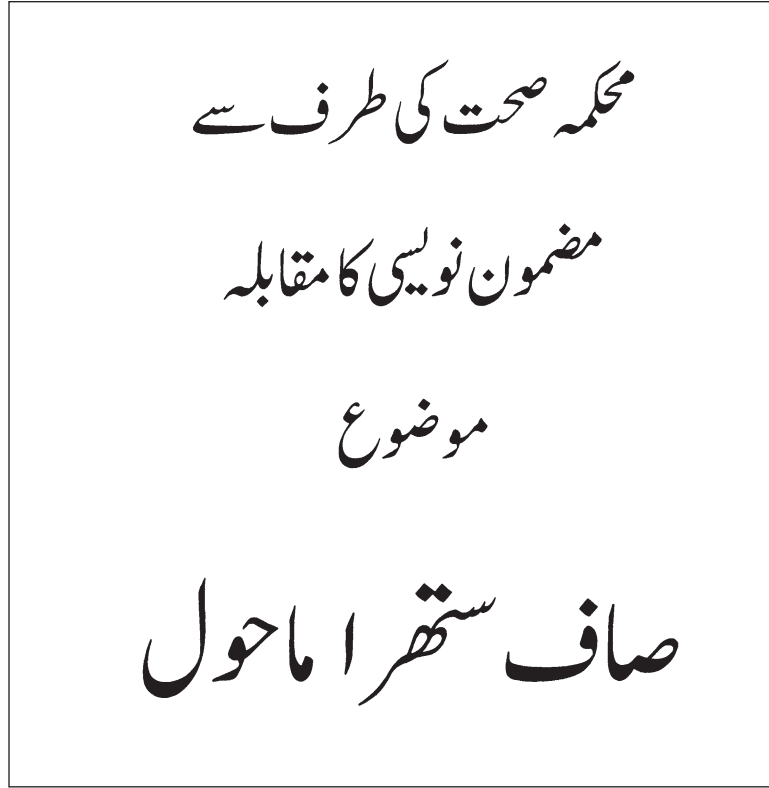

Part 3: Translation

Translate the following passage into **Urdu** (20 marks).

Ask an Englishman what is the hardest thing to learn and he will probably tell you that learning a foreign language is top of the list. This is because England is a country where most of the population speak only one language. This means that they don't get many chances to hear people speaking other languages. On the other hand, in many parts of the world it is not unusual for people to speak several languages. Take my old Pakistani friend Ghulam Ali as an example.
