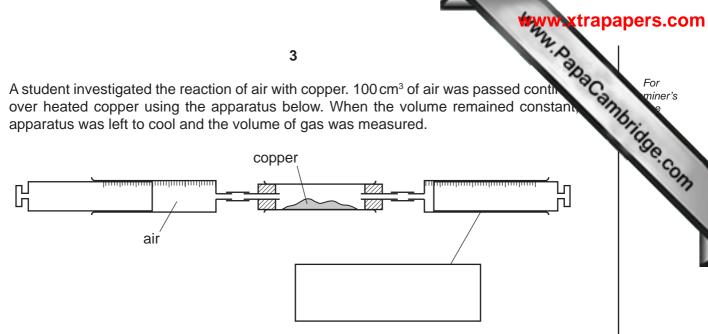

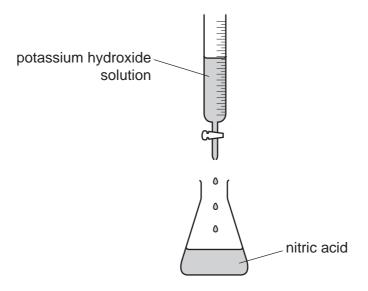

25.0 cm³ of nitric acid was poured into a conical flask. Potassium hydroxide was added a litt at a time from a burette as shown below.

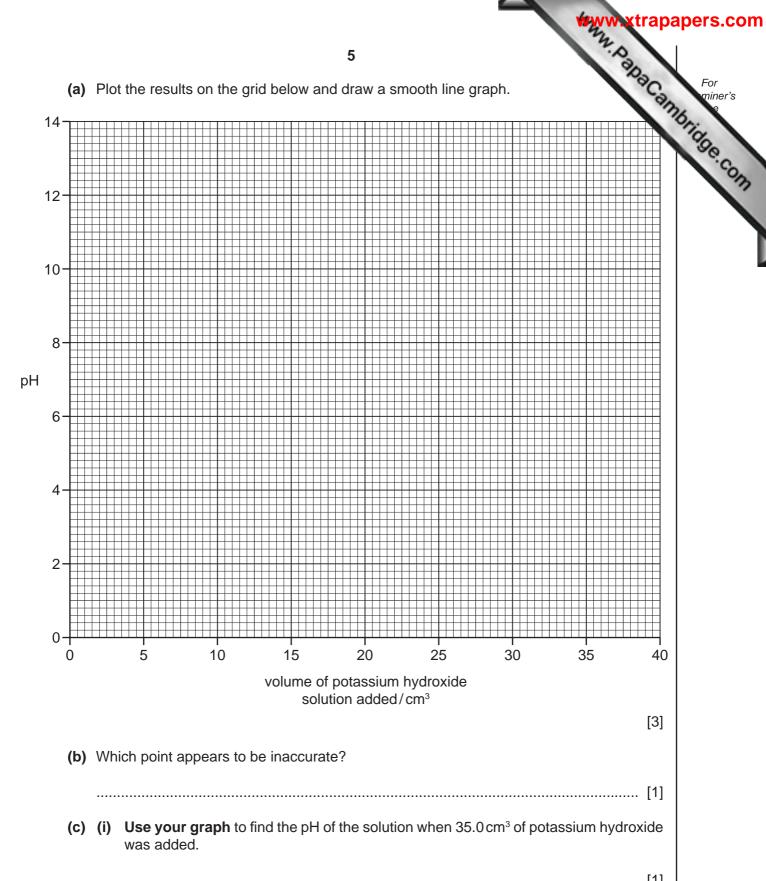


After each addition of potassium hydroxide solution the pH was measured with a pH meter and the values recorded in the table of results.

A student investigated the reaction between aqueous copper(II) sulfate and two metals, zinc and iron.

Two experiments were carried out.

Experiment 1

two a For miner's poured into a as started and Using a measuring cylinder, 25 cm3 of aqueous copper(II) sulfate was poured into a polystyrene cup. The temperature of the solution was measured. The timer was started and the temperature was measured every half a minute for one minute.

At 1 minute, 5 g of zinc powder was added to the cup and the mixture stirred with the thermometer. The temperature of the mixture was measured every half minute for an additional three minutes.

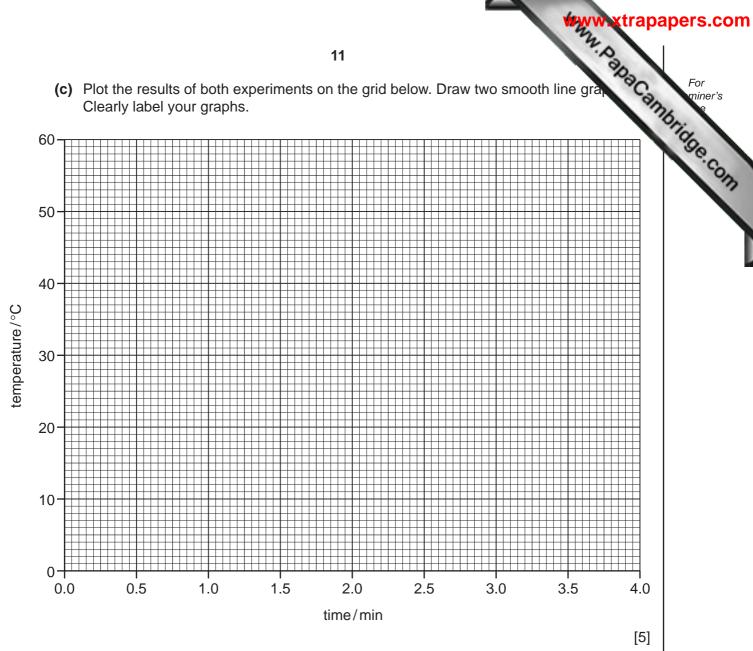
