
1 A farmer's family leave their muddy boots outside the door of the farm house.




Design a storage unit for eight pairs of boots which could be placed outside the farm house. Your design should include a method of removing excess amounts of mud.

- (d) Evaluate your three ideas. Choose one idea to develop further and justify your choice. [8]
- (e) Draw, using a method of your own choice, a full solution to the design problem. Include construction details and important dimensions. [12]
- (f) Suggest two suitable specific materials for the solution you have drawn in part (e) and give reasons for your choice. [4]
- (g) Outline a method that could be used to manufacture one part of your solution drawn in part (e). Include the names of the tools used. [6]

2 A farmer wishes to produce a roadside advertising stand for selling eggs.






Design an advertising stand. The stand should include a moving feature to attract people travelling along the road.

- (d) Evaluate your three ideas. Choose one idea to develop further and justify your choice. [8]
- (e) Draw, using a method of your own choice, a full solution to the design problem. Include construction details and important dimensions. [12]
- (f) Suggest two suitable specific materials for the solution you have drawn in part (e) and give reasons for your choice. [4]
- (g) Outline a method that could be used to manufacture one part of your solution drawn in part (e). Include the names of the tools used. [6]

3 A farmer wishes to release chickens automatically from a hen house in the morning.



Design a system which will release the chickens automatically each morning.

- (c) Develop and sketch three separate ideas for the system. [12]
- (d) Evaluate your three ideas. Choose **one** idea to develop further and justify your choice. [8]
- (e) Draw, using a method of your own choice, a full solution to the design problem. Include construction details and important dimensions. [12]
- (f) Suggest two suitable specific materials for the solution you have drawn in part (e) and give reasons for your choice. [4]
- (g) Outline a method that could be used to manufacture one part of your solution drawn in part (e). Include the names of the tools used. [6]
