Source 1

A migrant is someone who moves from one place to another, often to find work or better living conditions. An international migrant is someone who moves to live in a different country. There are an estimated 272 million international migrants around the world, which is 3.5 per cent of the world's population.

Migration has many effects on families. If one parent migrates this means they may not see their family for a long time. Their children may grow up without a father or mother as a role model and family life may be disrupted. There will be fewer people to share the workload in the home if one family member migrates. This may mean the family has less income.

However, some migrants send money back home to support their family. This increases their standard of living, enabling the family to afford better health care. It could also reduce the need for children to work, meaning they are able to go to school. This will give them better employment opportunities in the future and help them to contribute to the local economy.

Source 3: Migrant workers are good for our businesses

Business has been good this year. I have been able to employ an extra 110 people in our factory. I believe this is good for the country's economy.

Most of my new employees are migrant workers. I have provided them with a good wage and somewhere to live. I find that these migrants work hard and really appreciate the opportunity I have given them.

Most migrant workers come from small villages in rural areas. They come here to escape poverty and are proud to have a job in my factory. They always come to work on time and they are never absent. Productivity has also increased by 20 per cent since I started employing migrant workers.

Studies show that migrants make a positive contribution to local economies. The government says that there is a shortage of skilled workers in our area. Businesses should employ migrant workers to address this shortage.
