Task

- 1** A very popular teacher at your school is leaving after a long and successful career. The staff, students and parents are going to celebrate the teacher's career at a ceremony where the Principal will make a thank-you speech. The Principal asks you to write a report which gives information for the thank-you speech. The Principal also wants suggestions from you for what else to include in the ceremony.

Write your **report**. You must include the following:

- the name of the teacher **and** an outline of the teacher's career
- examples of what has made the teacher so popular and successful with students
- what events the students think should be included in the ceremony **and** why.

Cover all three points above **in detail**. You should make sure your report is polite and informative. Start your report 'To the Principal' and remember to supply a signature and date.

Write on **one** of the following topics.

At the head of your essay put the number of the topic you have chosen.

You are advised to write between 350 and 500 words. Total marks for this part: 30.
