Section A

The Life and Teaching of Jesus as Portrayed in Luke's Gospel

- 1 (a) Describe what happened when Jesus' parents took him to Jerusalem as a baby for the purification and presentation ceremony. [7]
(b) What do we learn about Jesus from this occasion? [5]
- 2 (a) Relate what happened on **two** of the occasions when Jesus was criticised for his actions on the Sabbath. [7]
(b) What do these events teach about (i) Jesus, and (ii) the Sabbath? [5]
- 3 (a) Give an account of the healing of Jairus' daughter. [7]
(b) What do we learn from this story about faith? [5]
- 4 (a) Relate the parable of the Tenants. [7]
(b) What was Jesus teaching through this parable? [5]
- 5 (a) Describe the events on the Mount of Olives before the crowd arrived with Judas to arrest Jesus. [7]
(b) What do these events tell us about Jesus? [5]

Section B

The Birth of the Church as Portrayed in the Acts of the Apostles Chapters 1–21:15

- 6 (a) Describe what happened from the time when Peter and John were brought before the Sanhedrin, until they were released. [7]
- (b) What do we learn from this event about why the early Christians were persecuted? [5]
- 7 (a) Give an account of the events involving Simon the sorcerer. [7]
- (b) According to Acts, in what ways were the Apostles changed through the coming of the Holy Spirit? [5]
- 8 (a) What does Acts tell us about the church at Antioch in Syria (not Antioch in Pisidia)? [7]
- (b) What contribution did Barnabas make to the growth of the Christian Church? [5]
- 9 (a) What did Paul tell the Athenians about “the God who made the world and everything in it”? [7]
- (b) What does Paul's sermon at Athens teach us about the varied approaches he adopted when preaching the gospel? [5]
- 10 (a) Relate what happened at Ephesus when some Jews tried to drive out evil spirits and explain the effect it had on both Jews and Greeks in the city. [7]
- (b) What do we learn about evil spirits from this account? [5]

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
