
Mo and his dad hope to cook food on the beach. They're bringing Mo's grandmother, who needs easy access to the beach, and they want to learn about local animals.

We're getting Sandy a thank-you present; a new play's coming to town, so we decided booking tickets for it would be perfect. A typical gift is a bunch of flowers, but someone's mum is bringing these from her garden. A friend suggested getting chocolates and we all agreed that was a nice idea.
