Option A: Comparative Government: The United Kingdom and the USA

Section A: The US Constitution

Study the source below and answer the question that follows.

Source

While realising the likely need to amend the Constitution, the authors wanted to make doing so a difficult process. It was to be a two-stage process requiring super majorities of more than 50%, such as a two-thirds or a three-fifths majority. Stage 1 is the proposal and stage 2 the ratification. Constitutional amendments can be proposed either by Congress or by a national constitutional convention called by Congress at the request of two-thirds of the state legislatures.

- (a) “Both American Presidents and UK Prime Ministers have a remarkable ability to ignore their cabinets.”
Evaluate this view. [30 marks]

- (b) “Members of Congress may have more legislative freedom than their UK counterparts, but they fail to make use of it.” Evaluate this view. [30 marks]

Option B: Comparative Government: The United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland

Section A: The Irish Constitution

Study the source below and answer the question that follows.

Source

Before the 2011 election, the Labour Party said it favoured a referendum on same-sex marriage. Fine Gael's manifesto was silent on the issue. In the end, following Oireachtas approval, the government agreed to put it to a referendum. The significance is that married couples enjoy the constitutional protection given to the family in relation to taxation and social welfare but unmarried couples do not. If the referendum passes, Ireland will become the first country in the world to approve same-sex marriage in a national referendum.
