Source

Tom Elliott has been replaced by Mike Nesbitt after only eighteen months as the Ulster Unionist Party leader. Nesbitt has his work cut out to establish a new identity that will stop the UUP being slowly absorbed by the Democratic Unionist Party. To survive long-term he needs to actually show voters that there is a difference between the two unionist parties. The DUP left the UUP trailing on engagement with the Gaelic Athletic Association and on attending the conferences of southern political parties such as Fine Gael.
