Source

The fallout from Sinn Fein's initial refusal to implement welfare reforms and the subsequent budget cuts led the First Minister to admit we need to change. There were daily public rows between ministers because there is no collective responsibility. In Dublin, where coalition government is the norm, Collective Cabinet Responsibility is in the constitution.

The Stormont institutions all too easily lead to ministerial "solo runs" and an inability of the Executive Committee to agree to decisions.
