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- 1 The most deprived in Northern Ireland are twice as likely to die from heart disease as the most affluent. Poor diet, smoking and lack of exercise are all behind the increased death toll, according to the Belfast Health Trust.

Dr Leslie Boydell said inequality imposed its own strains on top of poor lifestyles. “If you are less well off than someone else and live in a very unequal society it does impact on you psychologically and it does have a physical effect including on your health in terms of heart disease or cancer,” she said.
