1 (a) With reference to the relevant passages, explain how Jeremiah's message is one of warning and doom as well as the hope of a new covenant. [30 marks]

(b) Critically assess the view that Jeremiah's message is still relevant for the modern reader. [20 marks]

2 (a) "But you will not leave in haste or go in flight; for the Lord will go before you, the God of Israel will be your rear guard." (Isaiah 52:12)

With reference to this text, examine the theme of the New Exodus in the teaching of Deutero-Isaiah.

(b) Critically evaluate the claim that this author may be considered the greatest of the prophets. [20 marks]

3 (a) Outline and examine the significance of the Temple for the returning exiles in the work of Ezra and Nehemiah. [30 marks]

(b) Critically assess the view that Ezekiel's vision of the New Temple had little relevance for the Jewish people. [20 marks]

- 4 (a) With reference to relevant passages, analyse Josiah's response to the rediscovery of the Torah. [30 marks]
- (b) Critically evaluate the view that prophetic teaching on the duties of government is still relevant. [20 marks]
