- (b) Critically assess the view that the message of Ezekiel is still relevant. [20]
- 3 (a) Outline and examine the teaching of Deutero-Isaiah on the nature of God. [30]
- (b) Critically evaluate the claim that Deutero-Isaiah's teaching on the nature of God was only relevant for the time in which it was written. [20]
- 4 (a) Analyse the confrontation between King Ahab and the prophet Micaiah. [30]
- (b) Critically assess the view that the attitude of the prophets to people in authority was too harsh. [20]
