- 2 (a) Outline the possible sources of Shariah and consider how these are used by the Law Schools. [30]
- (b) Critically evaluate the claim that when it comes to respect for life issues, Shariah Law provides clear moral guidance. [20]
- 3 (a) Explain the origins and spiritual practices of Sufism. [30]
- (b) Critically assess the claim that Sufism forced the Muslim community to focus on issues which were of central importance in the Islamic faith. [20]
- 4 (a) Outline and explain the Qur'anic teaching on the role and status of women. [30]
- (b) "Islam has much to teach the non-Islamic world about honouring women, wives and mothers." Critically evaluate this view. [20]
