- 2 (a) With reference to relevant sources, outline and explain the origins and main characteristics of Gnosticism. [30]
- (b) Critically evaluate the claim that the challenge of heresy made the Church grow stronger. [20]
- 3 (a) Outline and consider how the writings of any major Christian writer you have studied contributed to the development of the Early Church. [30]
- (b) Critically assess the view that the study of early Christian literature has value for the Church in any age. [20]
- 4 (a) Identify and explain the main causes of the Arian controversy. [30]
- (b) Critically assess the view that the Council of Nicaea was a turning point in the history of the Christian Church. [20]
