Section A

Answer **two** questions from this section

- 1 (a) With particular reference to the available evidence, present the case for and discuss the Two Patricks theory. [30]
- (b) Critically evaluate the view that it would be a mistake to attribute the evangelisation of Ireland solely to Patrick. [20]
- 2 (a) Outline and examine the nature and importance of monastic spirituality in the Celtic Church. [30]
- (b) “The Celtic Church was conservative and yet open to change.”
Critically assess this claim. [20]
- 3 (a) Explain and consider the spiritual significance of **either** Cogitosus’ **Life of Brigit** or Muirchú’s **Life of Patrick**. [30]
- (b) Critically assess the view that such writings are merely of hagiographical interest. [20]
- 4 (a) Explain and consider how Gall, Killian and the Burgh Castle group continued the missionary work of Columbanus on the continent. [30]
- (b) “Missionary activity is often viewed in a negative light and is no longer necessary for the survival of the Church.”
Critically evaluate this view. [20]
