- 1 (a) Analyse the significance of the arrival, arrest and speeches of Paul in Jerusalem. [30]
- (b) Critically evaluate the claim that Christians must defend the gospel in the modern world regardless of the consequences. [20]
- 2 (a) With reference to the speeches at Pisidian Antioch and Athens, explain how Paul persuaded his Jewish and Gentile audiences of the truth he was proclaiming. [30]
- (b) With reference to Acts and the Letters, critically assess the view that Paul's only goal was to both defend and protect the Church. [20]
- 3 (a) With reference to Galatians, present the case for and discuss the view that central to Paul's teaching is justification by grace, through faith. [30]
- (b) Critically assess the claim that when Acts and Paul's Letters are compared, the two presentations of Paul are very different. [20]
- 4 (a) Analyse the reasons for and discuss Paul's guidance to the Corinthian Church in relation to worship and the celebration of the Lord's Supper. [30]
- (b) "The teaching of Paul to the Corinthians is vital for Christians today."
Critically assess this view. [20]
