- 1 (a) How was the persecution under the Emperor Diocletian different from other persecutions? [25]
- (b) “It was inevitable that the Diocletian persecution would fail.”
- Assess this view. Justify your answer. [25]
- 2 (a) “There were aspects of Constantine’s early life and rise to power which made him sympathetic to Christianity.”
- Examine this statement. [25]
- (b) Explore the view that the reasons for Constantine’s conversion were political rather than religious. Justify your answer. [25]

- 3 (a)** Discuss the development of the doctrine and practice of the Eucharist with particular reference to the New Testament and the Didache. [25]
- (b)** With reference to other aspects of human experience, assess the claim that for Christians the Eucharist is no longer the most important aspect of faith. Justify your answer. [25]
- 4 (a)** “Justin was hostile to Judaism.”
- In what ways can this remark be seen in Justin’s Dialogue with Trypho? [25]
- (b)** With reference to other aspects of human experience, evaluate the claim that theological issues continue to be a challenge for religious leaders. Justify your answer. [25]
