- 2 (a) "The idea of natural rights is problematic."
 Present a case for this view. [20]

- (b) Critically assess the claim that the practice of female genital cutting does not contribute to the "greatest happiness of the greatest number." [30]

- 3 (a) Clarify the distinction between *jus ad bellum* and *jus in bello*. [20]

- (b) To what extent is Just War theory still the most satisfactory argument in relation to global conflict? [30]
