Source A

Debt and Shopping

A family have to budget for unexpected expenses such as a car breaking down or a heating system, such as a boiler breaking down. This may cause debt, making it difficult for a family to pay essential bills.

A young person who ends up in debt may start to keep to a budget and track spending to try and pay money back. Another way to deal with debt is to seek free advice from the Citizens Advice Bureau.

Debit cards have many advantages as they are convenient and easy to use when out shopping, rather than using cash to purchase goods.
