SOURCE A

Contributing to Society in Northern Ireland

The Northern Ireland Assembly, Members of the Legislative Assembly (MLAs), and Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs) all make a valuable contribution to society in different ways.

The Northern Ireland Assembly safeguards human rights by ensuring laws are in place to protect human rights. It supports the work of the Northern Ireland Human Rights Commission and the Equality Commission. It ensures the government policies comply with equality and human rights legislation.

MLAs debate issues and make decisions that affect the future of society. They can be involved in creating laws. MLAs promote equality and diversity and ensure that Northern Ireland is a safe place in which to live and work.

Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs) contribute to society by helping people in need. They raise public awareness of issues. They educate and encourage people to support their work. However, fundraising and gaining public support is challenging.

SOURCE B

Debt and Shopping

A family have to budget for unexpected expenses such as a car breaking down or a heating system, such as a boiler breaking down. This may cause debt, making it difficult for a family to pay essential bills.

A young person who ends up in debt may start to keep to a budget and track spending to try and pay money back. Another way to deal with debt is to seek free advice from the Citizens Advice Bureau.
