2. To what extent can the politics of inclusion **or** exclusion be used to construct or to express identity **or** personhood?
3. Discuss how globalization affects **one** of the following:
  - community
  - ethnicity/race
  - kinship
  - socialization/enculturation/acclulturation.

### Classifying the world

4. Discuss how **either** ritual and religion **or** morality can be used to maintain boundaries.
5. To what extent are social relations influenced by **one** of the following:
  - health and illness
  - insider/outsider
  - language
  - purity and pollution?

### Communication, expression and technology

6. Discuss how technology **or** hybridity **or** commodification may be used to empower **or** to marginalize minorities.
7. Discuss processes of change in relation to **one** of the following:
  - forms of symbolic production
  - media and popular culture
  - political discourse
  - symbolic language.

**Conflict**

8. Discuss the role of **either** symbolism **or** ideology in conflict.
9. Discuss the relationship between power and resistance in **one** of the following:
- human rights
  - policing and security
  - systems of inequality
  - violence and suffering.

**Development**

10. Discuss how globalization **or** neo-colonialism has affected **either** development **or** exchange.
11. Discuss the relationship between culture and development with reference to **one** of the following:
- environmental sustainability
  - gender disparities
  - health
  - poverty.

**Health, illness and healing**

12. Discuss how **either** power **or** social relations affect health and illness in a society you have studied.
13. Discuss how health and healing practices are affected by **one** of the following:
- biomedicine
  - causation
  - hybridity
  - inequality.

**Movement, time and space**

14. Discuss how social relations influence the understandings of **either** time **or** space.
15. Discuss how identity **or** culture is related to **one** of the following:
- local and global movement
  - memory and remembrance
  - the social construction of space
  - virtual communities.

**Production, exchange and consumption**

16. Discuss the relationship between economic inequality and **either** power **or** symbolism.
17. Discuss how capitalism **or** colonialism **or** globalization has affected **one** of the following:
- commodification
  - consumption
  - systems of exchange
  - work and labour.

**The body**

18. Discuss how the body can be used to express **either** identity **or** power.
19. Discuss how social relations affect **one** of the following:
- bodily practices
  - commodified bodies
  - marginalized bodies
  - ritualized bodies.
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
