- 5 Compare and contrast the ways in which chief executives formulate and implement policy. [50]
- 6 Discuss the claim that entrenched rights provide better protection of rights and liberties than statute law. [50]
- 7 To what extent do the constraints on judiciaries prevent them from becoming political institutions? [50]
- 8 Assess the claim that law making is the most significant function of legislatures. [50]


