#### Source A

In the BBC's 'Meet the Lords' television series, it was claimed that some peers claim their full daily allowance of £300 despite contributing very little to the work of the House of Lords. However, the programme also highlighted some of the important duties carried out by peers, from debating and voting on legislation to their work in committees. An example of this is the work of Lord Dubs, and his campaign to push through an amendment to the Immigration Bill to allow unaccompanied refugee children into the UK.
