An understanding of the ethical issues and sources of error and bias to be taken into consideration when planning and carrying out the research project and justification of their choice of research methods [<b>10</b>];</p> <p><b>AO3:</b> research into their chosen area of study using different sources of information; presentation and analysis of their findings in an appropriate format [<b>15</b>];</p> <p><b>AO4:</b> an evaluation of the success of their research project using the predetermined aims and objectives and applying the issues of validity, reliability and representation with their recommendations for improvements and continuation of their research [<b>15</b>].</p>
