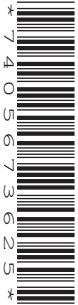


- 2 (a) Describe the technological and economic factors that affect patterns of eating and food choice. [10]
