Darius ordered the guards to seize Intaphrenes together with his sons and all his relatives<sup>4</sup>, but Intaphrenes' wife wept so much that eventually he promised to release one man. 'O King,' said the woman, 'I can obtain another husband and other children, but, since my mother and father are dead, I will never be able to have another brother. Therefore I beg you to release my brother.' The King was persuaded by the woman's words and released not only her brother but also her eldest son; but he put Intaphrenes and all the other men to death.**
