Answer **two** questions only.
Each question must be from a different topic area.

Early Cinema (1895–1915)

EITHER

- 3 'The Lumière brothers' role in the invention of cinema has been exaggerated'. To what extent do you agree with this claim? **[30]**

OR

- 4 Identify the factors which enabled the development of the American studio system, and discuss the impact of this on early cinema. **[30]**

The impact of World War II on British Cinema (1939–45)**EITHER**

- 5 To what extent did the existence of the Ministry of Information affect the types of films produced in Britain during the war years? [30]

OR

- 6 'The rise in cinema attendance in the war years was purely due to the public's desire to find out news about the war'. To what extent do you agree with this claim? [30]

The rise of the blockbuster, format wars and multiplexes (1972–84)**EITHER**

- 7 Discuss the impact blockbuster films have had on film distribution. [30]

OR

- 8 'The introduction of censorship for the home video market in the early 1980s was completely unnecessary'. To what extent do you agree with this claim? [30]

Developments in 21st Century Cinema and Film (2000 – present)**EITHER**

- 9 'Internet piracy is killing the film industry'. Discuss this claim with reference to specific examples. [30]

OR

- 10 To what extent do 3D films offer value for money for audiences? [30]
