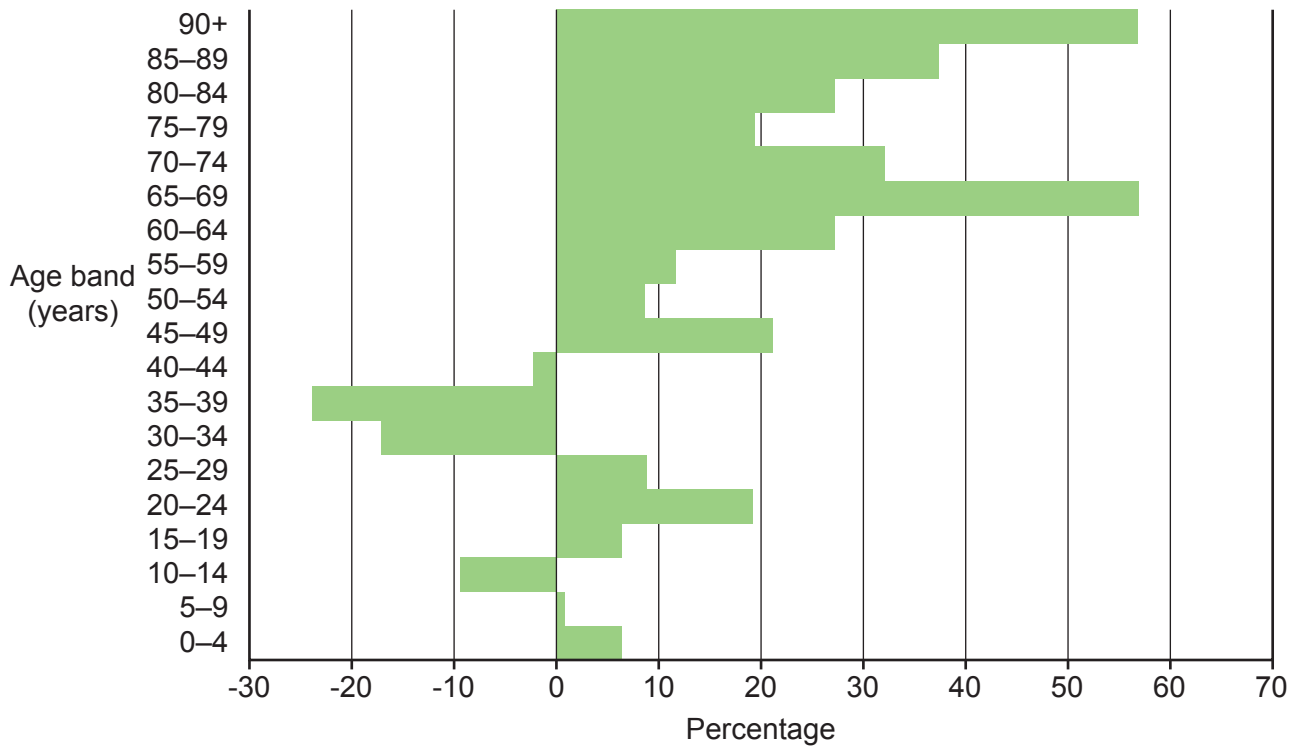

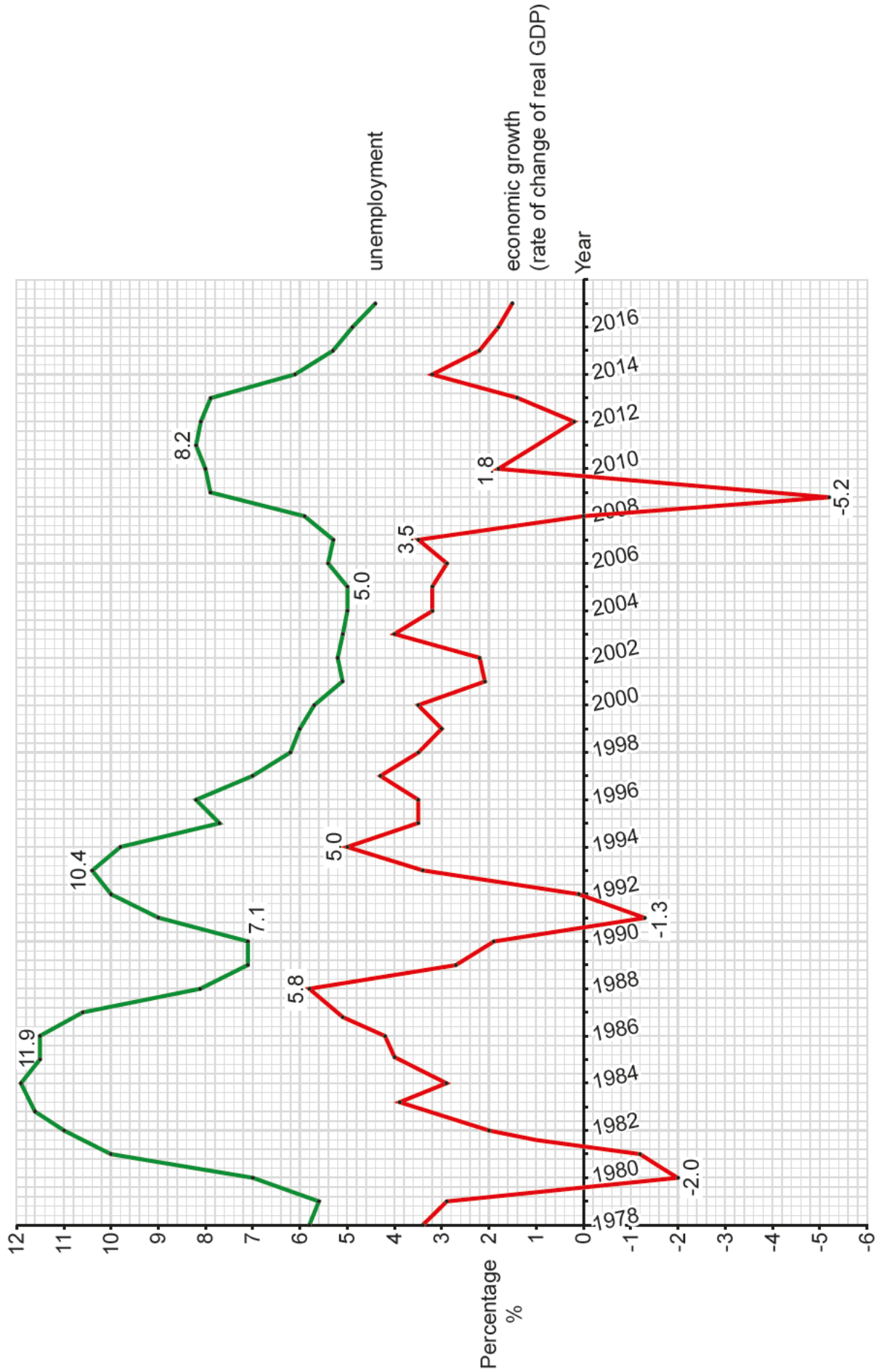


Fig. 2 – Cyclical economic change in the UK between 1978 and 2017
