Task 2 – Spreadsheet Model [Total 29 marks]**2 a(i)** Printed evidence shows

Note: Zero marks if row and column headings are missing

- 1 ■ The *Purchase* and *Fees* worksheets are each printed on one side of A4
- The *Purchase* worksheet has the Total Purchase Cost Model on the left and the Mortgage Model on the right
- 2 ■ *Stamp duty* is **£0**
- *Legal fee* is **£800** and VAT on the legal fee is **£160** or a combined value of **£960** may be given
- *Total Purchase Cost* is **£151,510**
- 3 ■ *Maximum Mortgage* is **£135,000**

a(ii) Annotated evidence of the formulae explains how

Note – Row and Column headings must be present to allow for cross referencing of the formulae with the printed model in a(i)

- 4 ■ *Stamp Duty* is calculated correctly according to the price bands given in Table 2.2 and is calculated as a percentage of the property price
- *Stamp Duty* would not be paid by first time buyers who purchase a property priced at £250,000 or less
- 5 ■ *Legal Fee* for Land or Commercial property are calculated as a percentage of the property price (1% and 1.5% respectively)
- *Legal Fee* for Residential property is a fixed fee of £800
- 6 ■ *Total Purchase Cost* is calculated by adding the *Property Price*, *Stamp Duty*, *Legal Fee* (including VAT), *Search Fee* and *Recording Fee*
- 7 ■ *Maximum Mortgage* is calculated as the greater of either four times the highest salary or three times the joint salary
- *Mortgage Required* is calculated as Total Purchase Cost minus Deposit

Annotated evidence shows how:

- 8 ■ A drop-down list to select the type of property purchased is implemented
- 9 ■ A check box to indicate whether a purchaser is a first time buyer is implemented
- 10 ■ A validation check is made to see if the deposit value is less than 10% of the *Property Price*
 ■ A suitably customised error message is displayed
- 11 ■ A green background is displayed in the *Mortgage Required* cell when *Mortgage Required* \leq *Maximum Mortgage*
 ■ A red background is displayed in the *Mortgage Required* cell when *Mortgage Required* $>$ *Maximum Mortgage*
- 12 ■ A print button was implemented (eg Macro or code)
 ■ The print range is customised to print just the Total Purchase Cost Model area of the *Purchase* worksheet
- 13 ■ Property Price, Property Category, First Time Buyer Status, Salary 1, Salary 2, and Deposit can be edited while all other cells are protected

- 17 ■ Regular Monthly Payment is **£839.39**
 ■ Total Monthly Payment is **£939.39**
 ■ Total Repayments is **£188,500.76**
 ■ Total interest is **£58,500.76**
 ■ Repayment period is exactly **16** years and **9** months
- 18 ■ The variables Mortgage Amount **£130,000**, APR **4.74%**, Term **20** and Overpayment **£100** have been entered
 ■ Values for Regular Monthly Payment, Total Monthly Payment, Total Repayments, Total Interest, Years and Months are present

c(ii) Annotated evidence of the formulae explains how

Note – Row and Column headings must be present to allow for cross referencing of the formulae with the printed model in c(i)

- 19 ■ Regular Monthly Payment is calculated
 ■ Total Monthly Payment is calculated as the Regular Monthly Payment plus Overpayment
- 20 ■ The last Total Monthly Payment is automatically reduced to make sure the final balance is £0.00
- 21 ■ Interest for any given Monthly Payment Period is calculated as the Initial Balance multiplied by the APR divided by 12 (or equivalent)
 ■ The Interest is rounded up to the nearest penny
 ■ The Balance Remaining for a Monthly Payment Period is calculated as the Initial Balance plus the Interest minus the Total Monthly Payment (or equivalent)
- 22 ■ Total repayment calculation correctly adds all Total Monthly Payments
 ■ Total interest calculation correctly adds all Interest payments
- 23 ■ The Years and Months to complete the mortgage are automatically calculated

- 24 ■ The message reads: An overpayment of £100.00 per month will mean that you save £12,951.05 in interest and repay the loan 3 years and 3 months early
- Currency values are formatted correctly to two decimal places
- 25 ■ The graph is printed on one side of A4
- The X axis is labelled Payment Period
- The Y axis is labelled Mortgage Balance
- A line for regular payments is present and identifiable and has a value of £0.00 in payment period 240
- A line for overpayments is present and identifiable and has a value of £0.00 in payment period 201

- 26 ■ The data for two sets of monthly payments (Regular Monthly Payment and Overpayment) are calculated and used within the graph eg expansion of the model, macros or code
- 27 ■ The interest to be saved from making regular overpayments is automatically calculated correctly
- 28 ■ The time period in years and months that would be saved is automatically calculated correctly
- 29 ■ The message is inserted automatically into the graph

 ■ Type of property is 15 or fewer characters
- 4 ■ At least three different types of validation check are given eg
 Lookup check for Property Type, Range check for Number of bedrooms (> 0), Presence check for Address, Picture / Format check for Postcode
 ■ The validation checks given are sensible

- 16 ■ a validation check is implemented (eg range check, minimum price ≥ 0)
■ the validation rule is tested
- 17 ■ the price range is matched between the minimum and maximum prices
■ the minimum number of bedrooms is matched

- 18 ■ the 'any' property status is managed correctly within the search
- 19 ■ the number of properties that match the search criteria is calculated and dynamically displayed on the screen as the search parameters are changed
