**3** Consider the possibility of successful claims in trespass to the person in each of the following situations:

**(a)** Derek suspects that Amanda has been stealing flowers from his garden. He catches her by his garden gate with a bunch of roses but Amanda claims that she bought them from the local shop. Derek does not believe her and locks her in his garden shed, telling her that he is going to call the police. Derek changes his mind about calling the police but leaves Amanda in the shed for five hours. When Derek lets Amanda out of the shed she produces a receipt from the shop where she bought the roses. **(b)** Rafiq has been stalking Shahida, his ex-girlfriend, for some time. He follows her around, emails her and writes letters to her asking her to go out with him again. However, today Shahida received a telephone call from Rafiq making a number of threats that 'if he can't have her, he will make sure nobody else can either'. Shahida is very frightened by this threat and has a mental breakdown. [10]

**(c)** Charlie has found out that Dave has been spreading false rumours about him at the rugby club. He decides to take revenge. Next time Charlie and Dave are playing in opposing teams, Charlie tackles Dave hard around the neck even though Dave does not have the ball, causing Dave a broken collar bone. [10]
