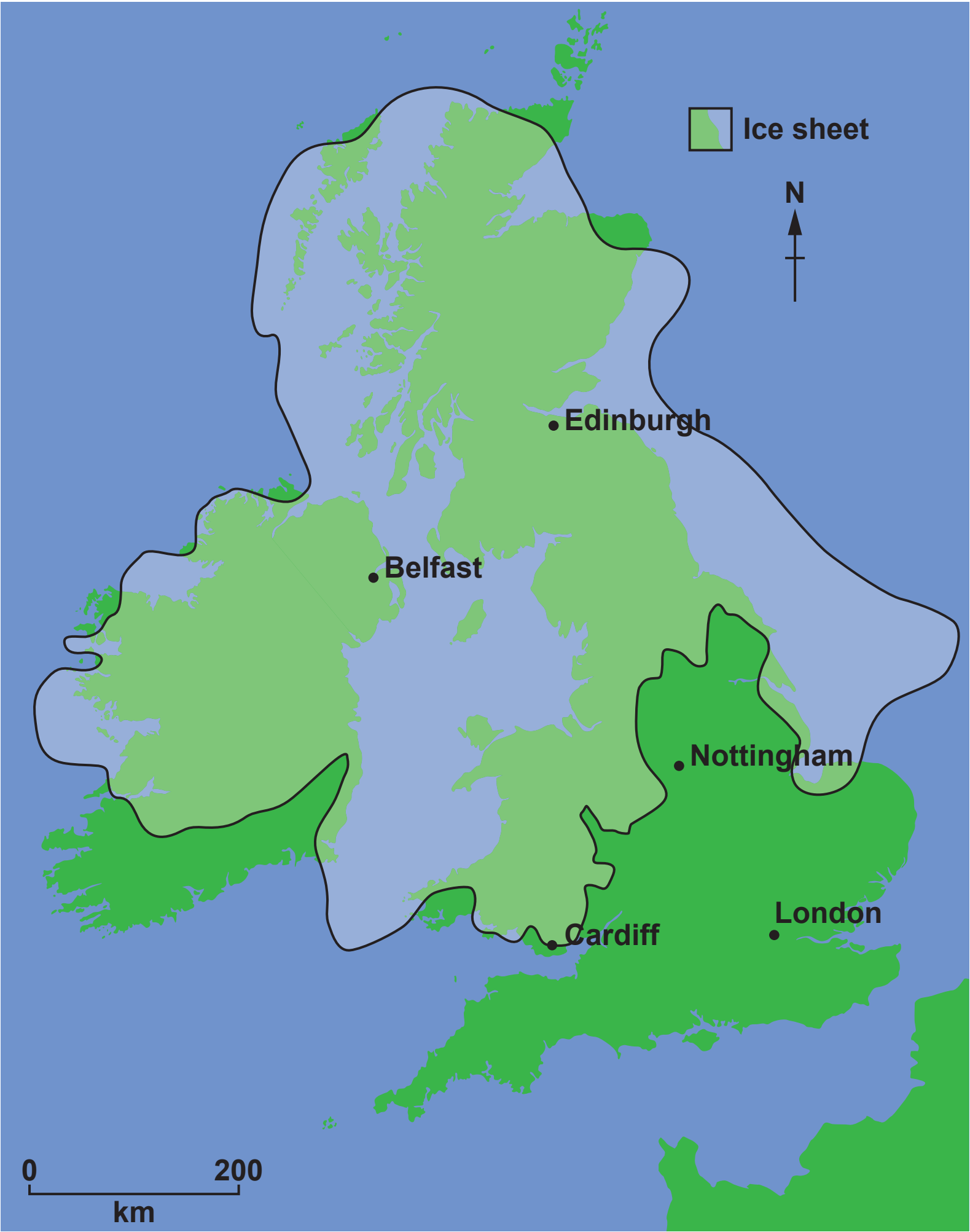


Fig. 2 – Photograph of Blakeney Point spit

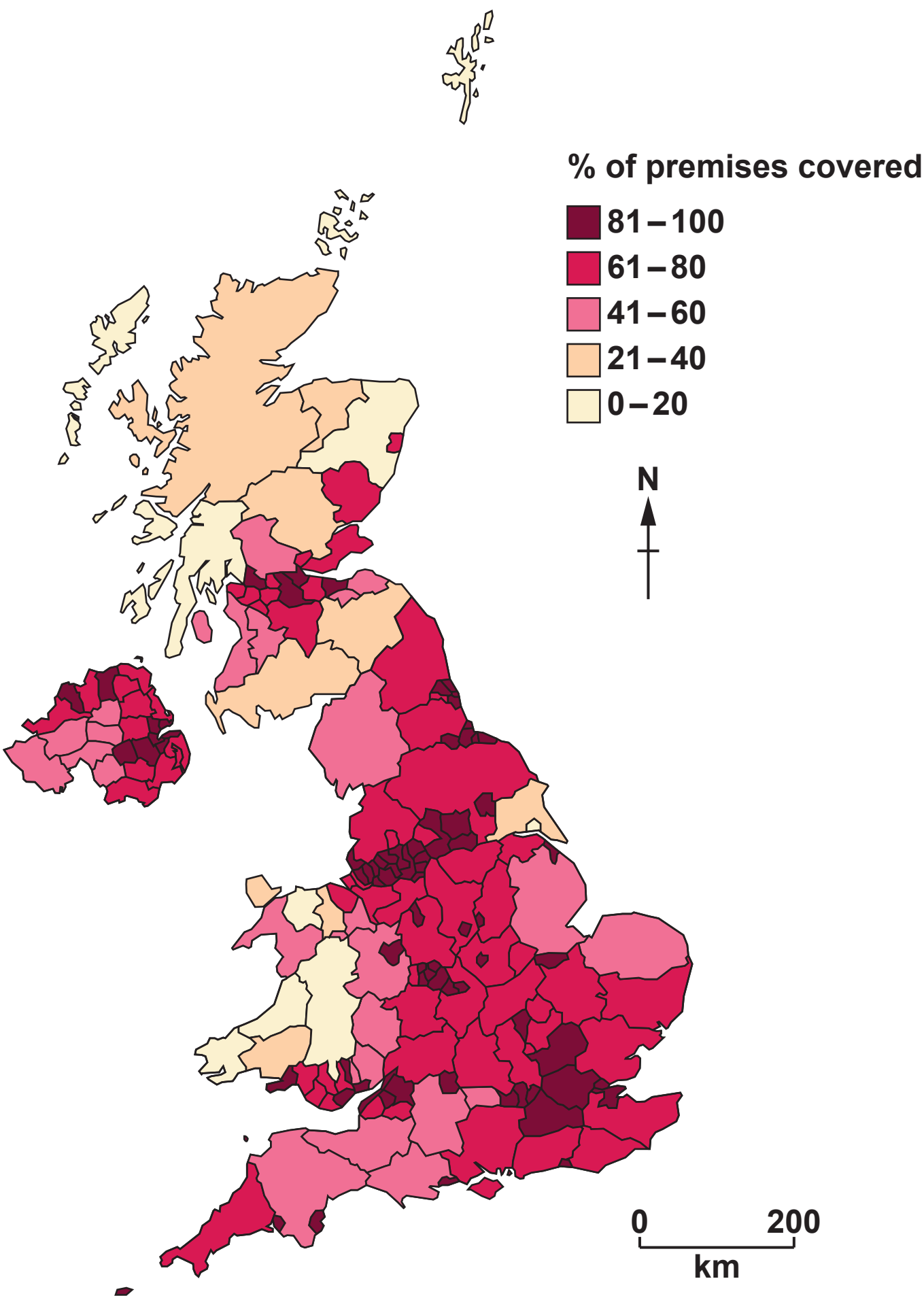


Fig. 4 – Demographic transition in the UK

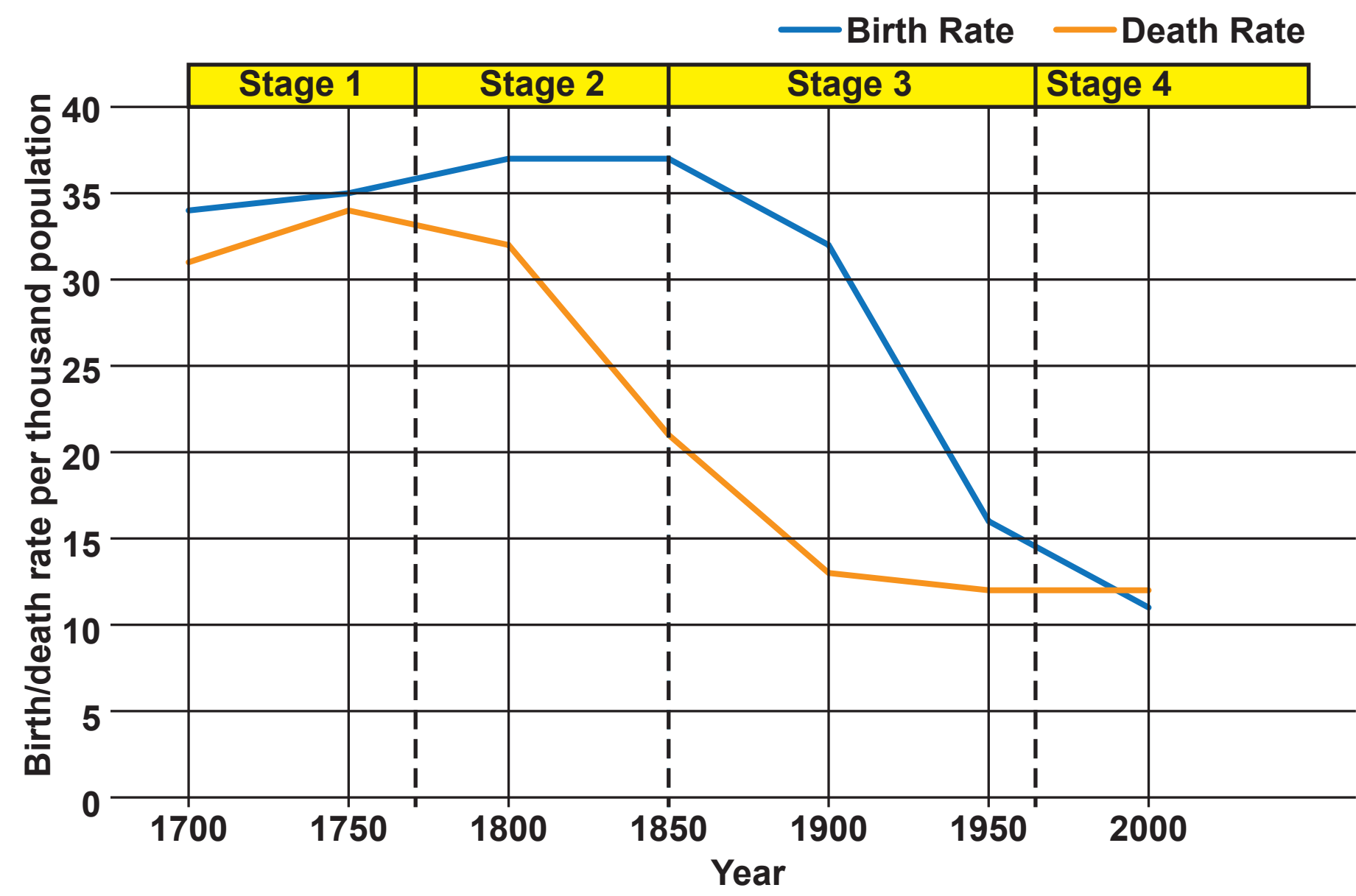


Fig. 5 – Energy sources used to produce electricity in the UK in 2009 and 2020 (predicted)
