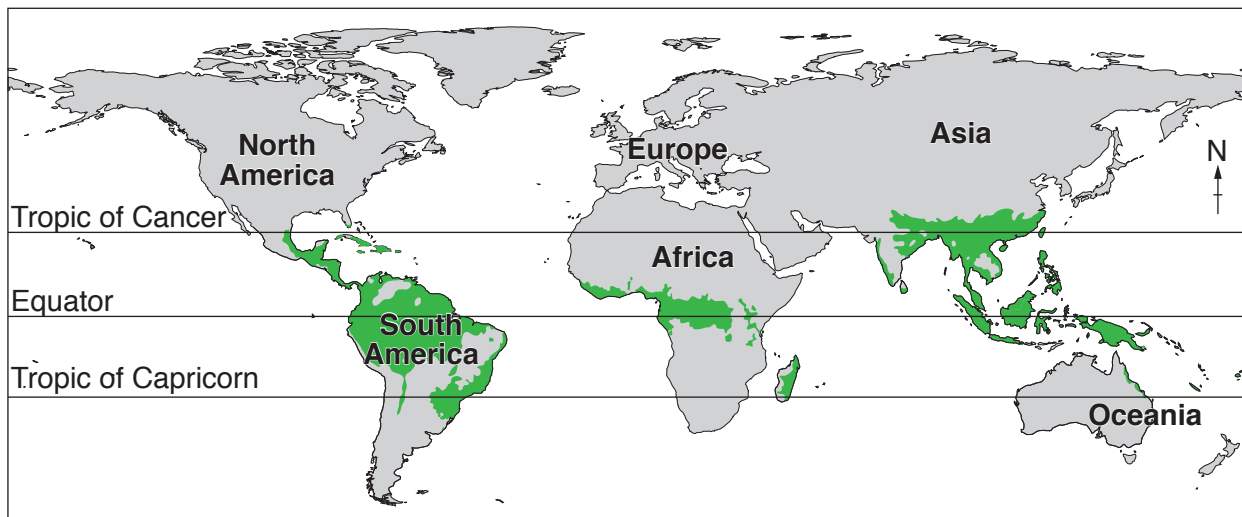

Fig. 2 – Tropical rainforest water cycle.

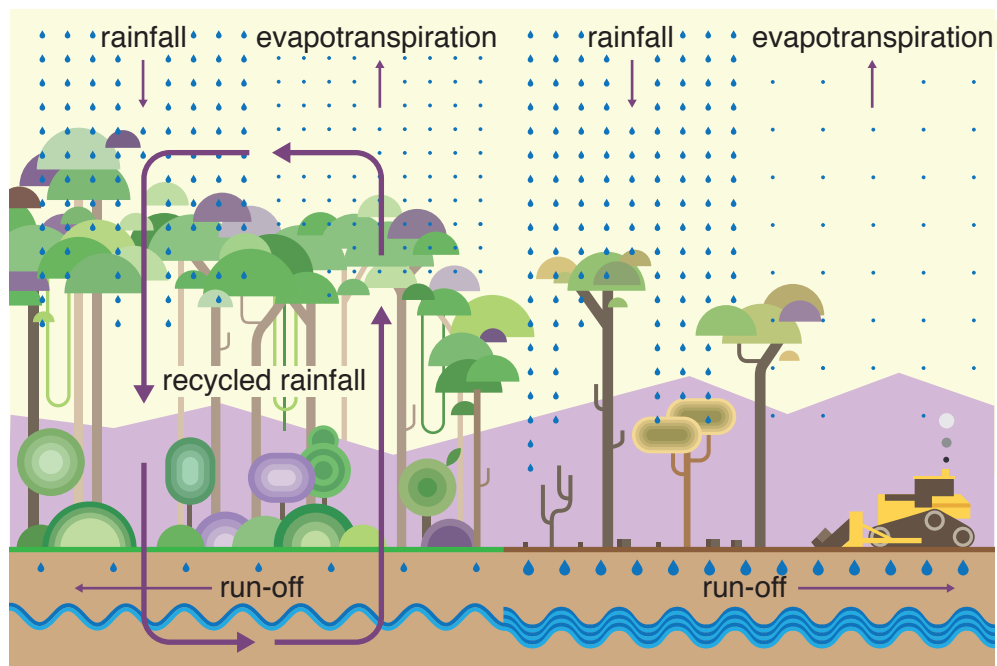


Fig. 3 – Climate change cartoon.
