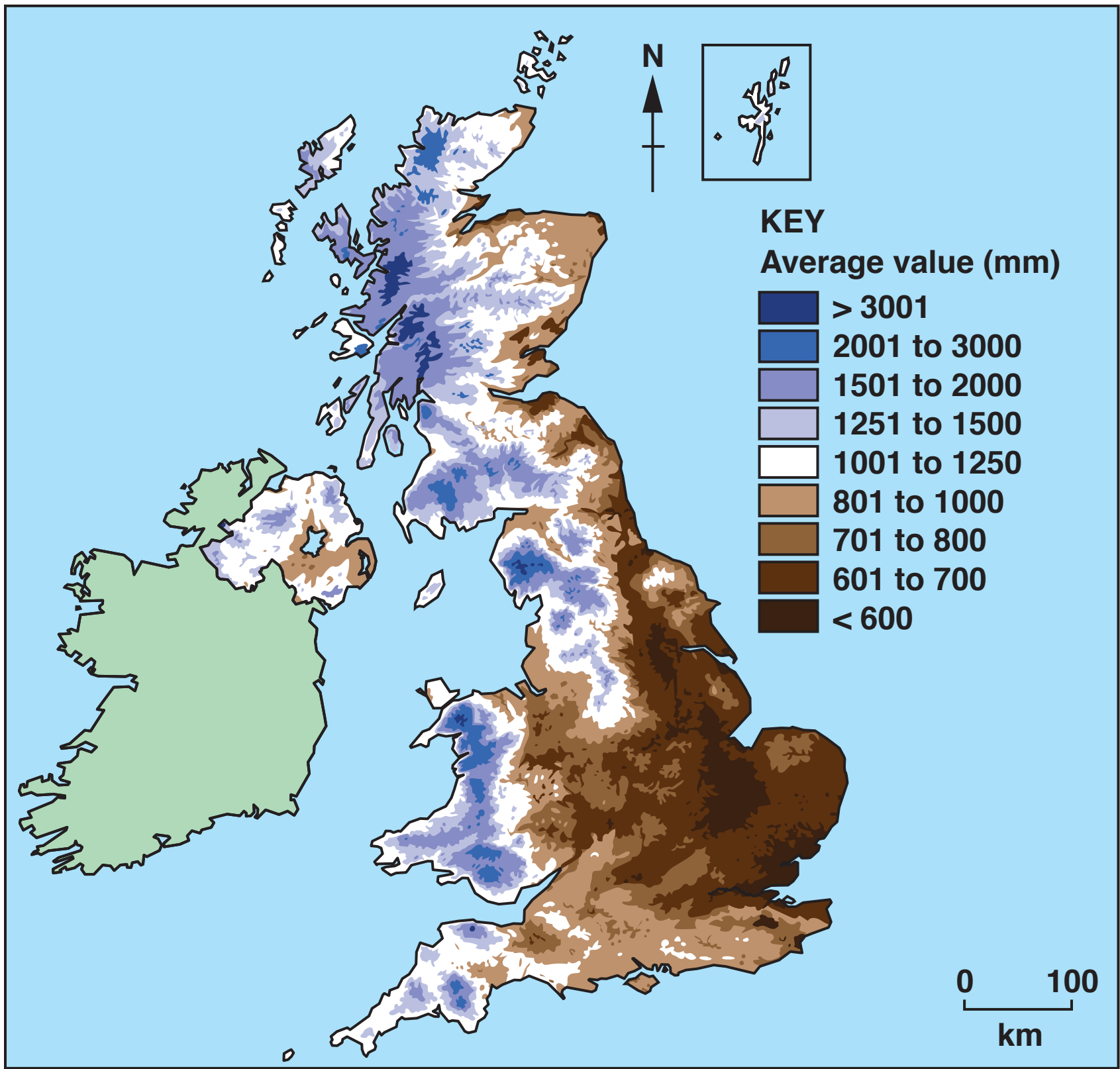


Fig. 4 Forecast household use of water 2029–30.

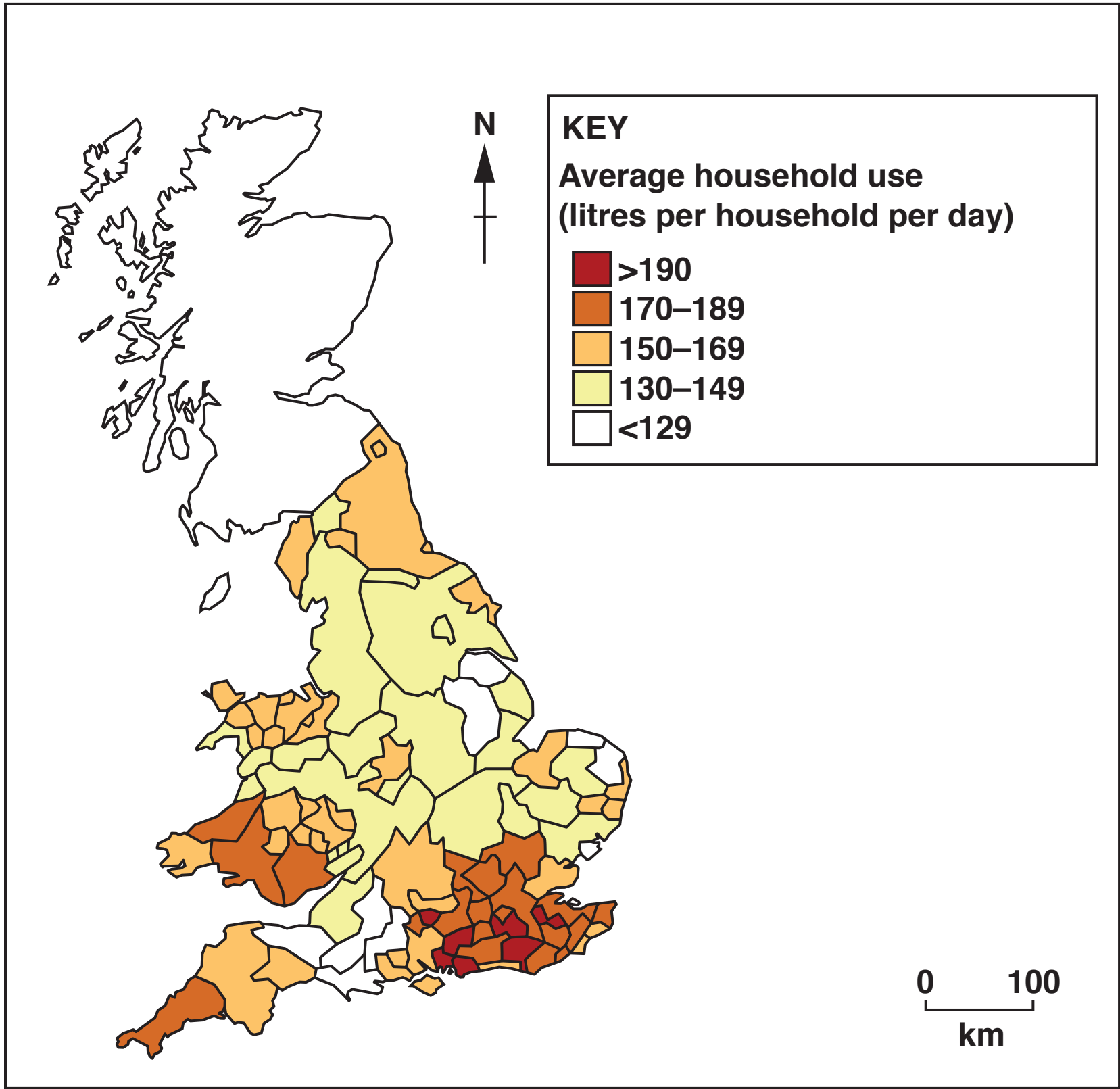


Fig. 5 World map showing food security risk index by country.

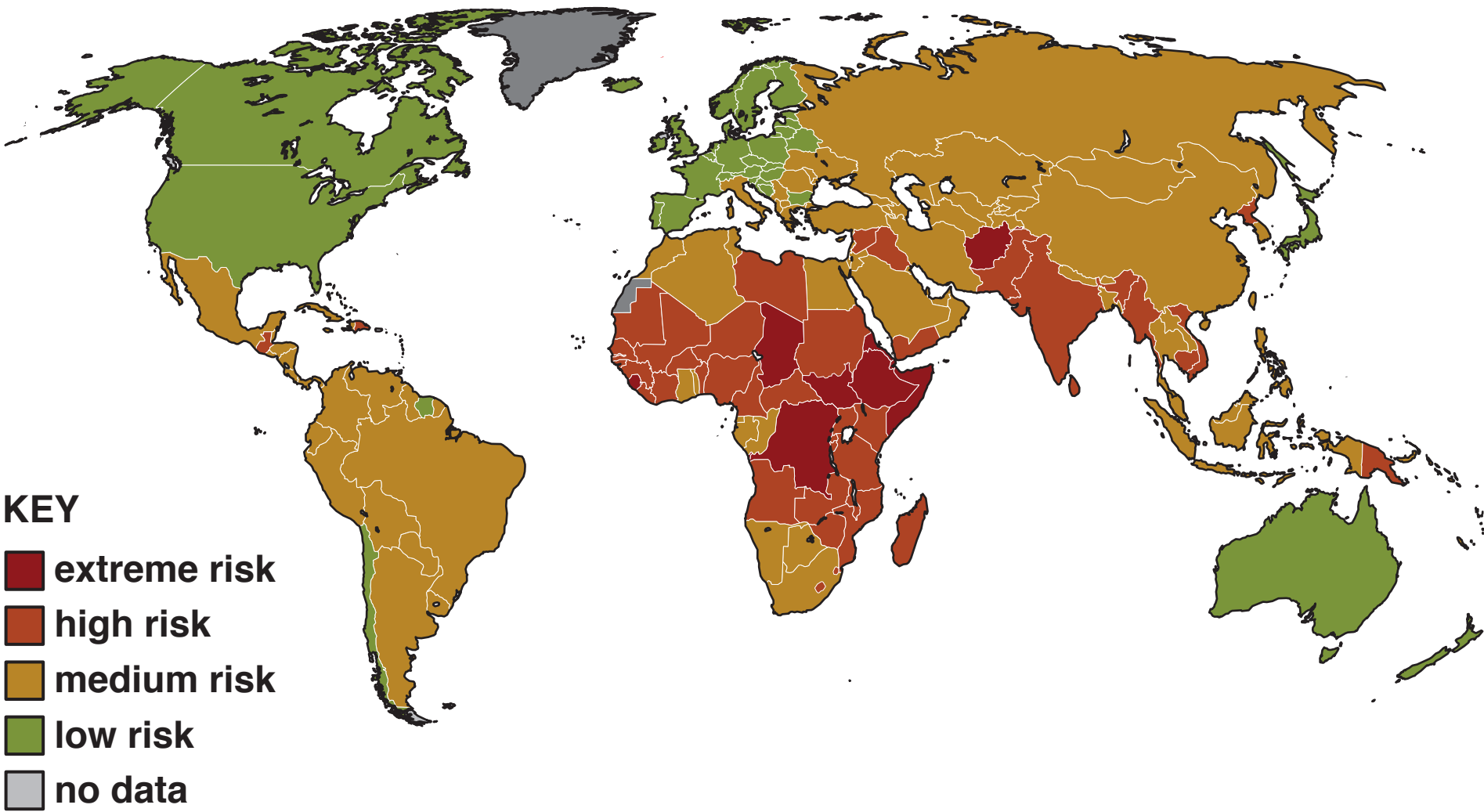


Fig. 6 – Traffic congestion in the city of Norwich.

Fig. 7b – Population change in the city of Norwich.

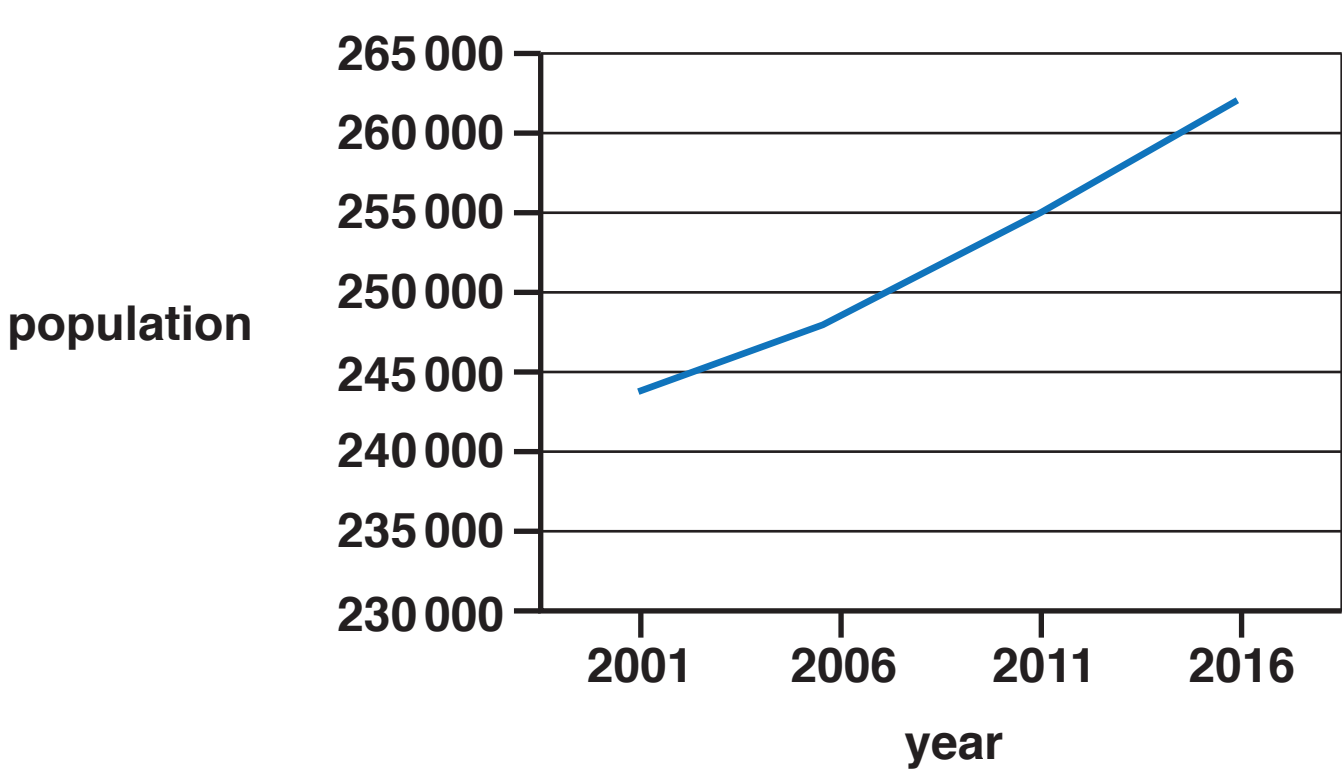
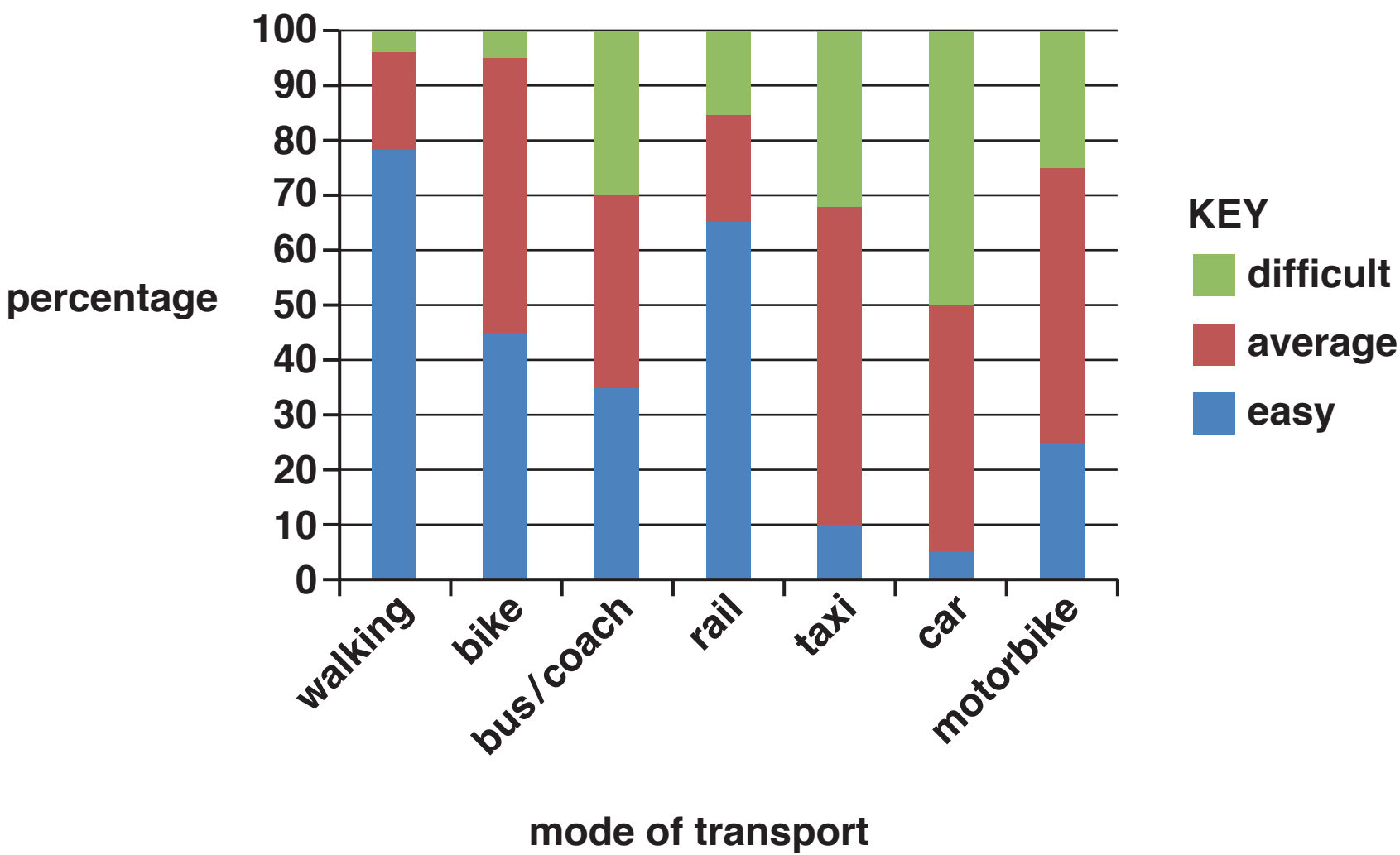


Fig. 7c – Residents’ opinions on ease of use of different transport types.
