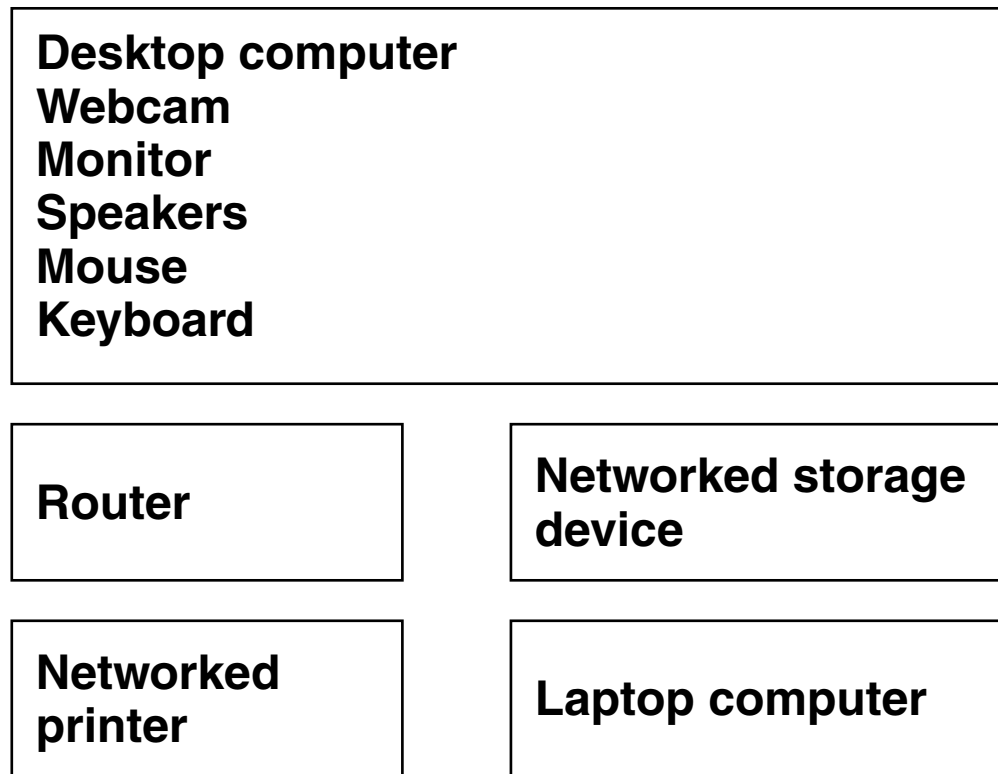

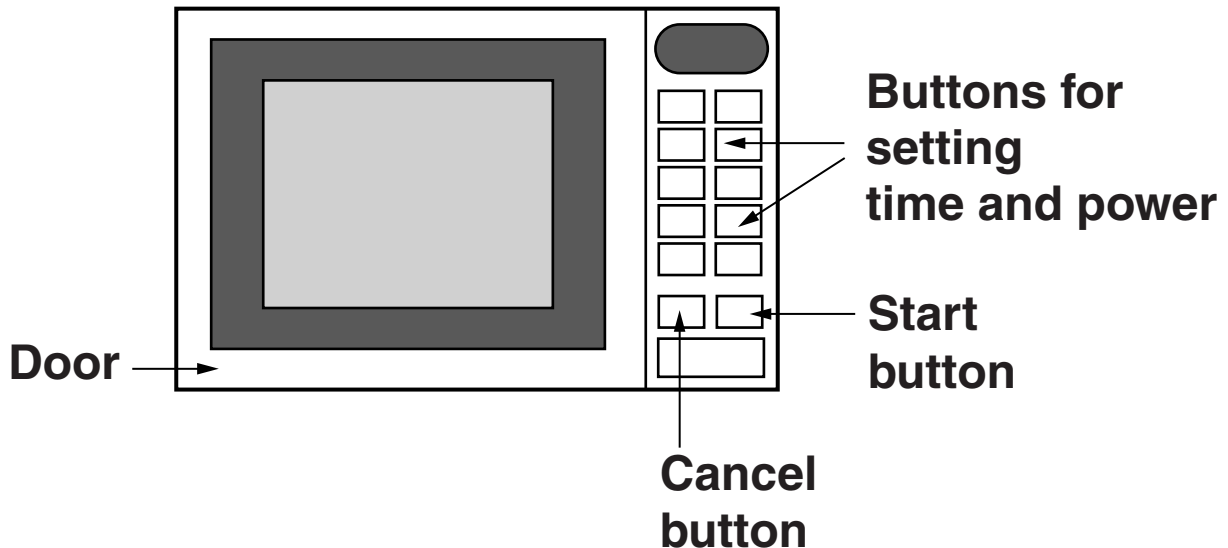
(ii) Cells B13 to E13 are formatted so that the contents appear as whole numbers.

When the user presses the start button, the system makes three checks before starting the microwave oven. First it checks that the time has been set, then that the power has been set and then that the door is closed.

The system will stop the oven if:

the cancel button is pressed

or

the set time is reached.
