- 3** say how long you have lived in your home and give an example of a special event you have done or will do and how you feel about it;
- 4** describe one thing you would like to change in your home and say why;
- 5** imagine that you have the opportunity to design your own home in the future. What would it be like and why?

- to give factual information **and** explain ideas and points of view (your own or those of others)
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses.

- 2** describe a typical day during the educational exchange;
- 3** describe something interesting you did on an exchange, or are planning to do in the future, and how you feel about it;

- 5** imagine that you have the opportunity to live and go to school in a different country. Where would you go and why?
