Source B

By 1568 most Catholics in England had accepted Elizabeth's new Church. Only 250 out of 9,000 priests lost their jobs. The fines for not attending church services were not strictly enforced and in many places they were not collected at all. Elizabeth's tolerant approach seemed to have worked.
